
Dissection Expectations







A proper dissection means the thorough examination of an organism in order to learn about it and yourself.

These organisms gave up their lives for us to learn from them and should be treated with respect.

 Wear gloves at all times- you don't take the gloves off until after all cleanup is done.





Peel downwards, away from the wrist, turning the glove inside-out.

Peel downwards, away from the wrist, turning the glove inside out.

Pull the glove away until it is removed from the hand, holding the inside-out glove with the gloved hand.

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With your un-gloved hand, slide your finger/s under the wrist of the remaining glove. **Do not touch** the outer surface of the glove.

- We will rinse the specimen with water prior to dissecting.
- Any spills should be wiped up immediately.



- Absolutely no horseplay
- Organisms stay on the tray at all times.
- No body parts leave the classroom.
- Do not eat any part of the specimen.

- Stay seated during dissection labs and do not leave your group.
- Bumping into someone could cause a huge problem.



 Tools should only be used as instructed. Severe consequences could result from the misuse of tools.



 Never cut until you absolutely have to AND have been told to.

 Do not make incisions (cuts) while holding the specimen. It should be pinned down in the dissection tray.

- Never cut towards others or yourself.
- Only pins should be stuck through the specimen and into the mat.
- Never cut into the mat

- Any parts that are removed need to be left in the dissection tray until the end of the dissection.
- Specimens and all their parts need to be placed in a baggie for disposal.

- Clean up the work area and return all equipment to the proper place when the dissection is completed.
- Groups that do not cleanup properly will receive a reduced grade on their lab.

- Remove gloves only after all cleanup is finished.
- Wash hands with soap and water after each dissection.

For cuts:

–Inform teacher immediately

- -Clean cut under water in the sink.

Accident Procedures:

Accidental exposure to preservative: —Rinse affected area with clean water

- If in mouth or eyes
- –Inform teacher immediately
- Rinse with water repeatedly for at least 2 minutes
- -You may be sent to the nurse
